

# Tanks

## T-28 Tank – 170 points

**In Service:** 1934    **Availability:** C    **Asset:** Armour

The T28 Medium tank was the result of a period of worldwide multi turreted tank design in the early 1930's. The T-28 was an impressive looking vehicle but difficult to command.

With the advent of World War II the design was found to be flawed, but the Soviets still used the T28 during both the winter war against Finland, and during Operation Barbarossa in 1941 and kept them in action until 1944.

**Unit:** T-28 tank with 76.2mm L tank gun and one Co-Axial MG and one rear turret mounted MG, one independent turret MG (FaF, FaL), one independent turret MG (FaF, FaR),

**Rear Turret Mounted:** Some tanks featured MGs that were mounted in the back of the main gun turret. This MG can only shoot in the fire arc opposed to the main gun.

**Options:**

- A Pintle MG (FaF) may be added for +25 points.



**T-34 Tank – 190 points**

**In Service:** 1941    **Availability:** C    **Asset:** Armour

Constantly refined during the war, the T-34 was widely regarded to have been the world’s best tank when the Soviet Union entered World War II. Its efficient sloped armour design influenced future tanks from all nations. The superior rear armour sloping and the smaller silhouette resulted in a better protection from the rear than the sides.

**Unit:** T-34 tank with 76.2mm tank gun and one Co-Axial MG, one Hull mounted MG (FaF)

**Tank Rider:** The T-34 can transport up to 6 models (maximum Size 1) on its engine deck. The transported infantry models count as in medium Cover against shooting attacks from the Forward facing, but do not receive Cover from other facings.

**Options:**

- **T-34/40 Model 76 A:** The T-34 may be downgraded to the uncommon 1940 Model 76 A. This costs -10 points and replaces the 76.2mm tank gun with a 76.2mm L tank gun.

## T-34/85 Tank – 255 points

**In Service:** 1944    **Availability:** C    **Asset:** Armour

With a three-man turret and long 85mm main gun, the T-34/85 was a substantial improvement on the original design, and a fearsome opponent.

**Unit:** T-34/85 tank with 85mm L54 tank gun and one Co-Axial MG, one Hull mounted MG (FaF)

**Tank Rider:** The T-34/85 can transport up to 6 models (maximum Size 1) on its engine deck. The transported infantry models count as in medium Cover against shooting attacks from the Forward facing, but do not receive Cover from other facings.

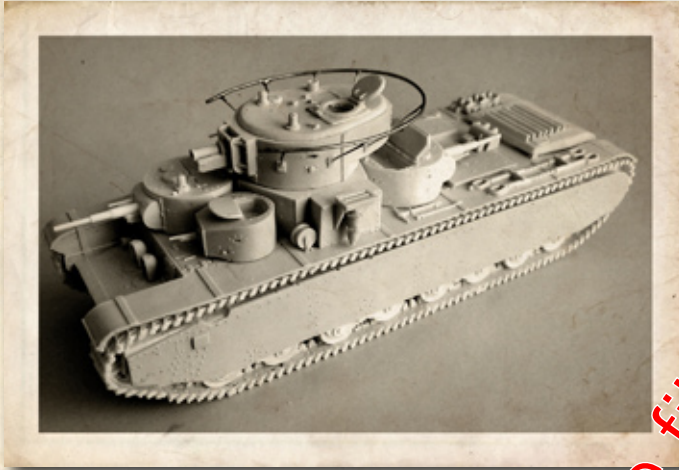


**T-35 Heavy Tank – 240 points**

**In Service:** 1935    **Availability:** R    **Asset:** Armour

The T-35 was the only five-turreted heavy tank in the world to reach production. Because of the high cost it saw only limited production and service in the Soviet Army. The T-35 was also slow, thin armoured and mechanically unreliable. Because of its huge size it was shown many times for propaganda use.

**Unit:** T-35 tank with 76.2mm L tank gun and one Co-Axial MG and one rear turret mounted MG, one independent turret 45mm L46 gun (FaF, FaL) and one Co-Axial MG (FaF, FaL), one independent turret 45mm L46 gun (FaF, FaR) and one Co-Axial MG (FaF, FaR), one rear independent turret MG (FaA, FaL), one rear independent turret MG (FaA, FaR),

**Rear Turret Mounted:** Some tanks featured MGs that were mounted in the back of the main gun turret. This MG can only shoot in the fire arc opposed to the main gun.

**T-50 Light Tank – 140 points**

**In Service:** 1935    **Availability:** R    **Asset:** Armour

The T-50 light infantry tank was built by the Soviet Union at the beginning of World War Two. The T-50 was an advanced design and well ahead of its time. It featured a torsion-bar suspension, a diesel engine and sloped all-welded armour. On the downside it was complicated and expensive, and only a short production run of 69 tanks was completed.

**Unit:** T-50 light tank with 45mm L46 gun and one Co-Axial MG

**Options:**

- Up to 2 extra T-50 may be added to the unit for +140 points each.
